Annette was last seen in Norwich Road, Ipswich, at 9.50pm on Tuesday, 5 December, by a member of the public. At that time she was wearing dark grey patterned leggings, calf-length boots, a black top with a low neckline and a dark-coloured bomber jacket.

When her body was found it was naked, although she still had her jewellery on.

"We are extremely keen to trace Annette's clothing, as well as the clothing of the other women," said Det-Chief-Supt Gull.

"I would also like to repeat my appeal for anyone who has used the two laybys on the Old Felixstowe Road near where the bodies were found at Levington to come forward. We know they are well used by motorists and we need to trace anyone who stopped there between Sunday, 3 December, and when the bodies were found on Tuesday, 12 December."

Suffolk Police is now receiving assistance from 26 other police forces across the country. Over 250 police officers and specialist police staff have been drafted in to help in the search for those responsible for these five murders.
