

Critical adjudication against Pick Me Up Magazine

The PCC today publishes a critical adjudication against Pick Me Up magazine.

A woman complained that the magazine's account of her relationship with a vicar was inaccurate in breach of Clause 1 (Accuracy) of the Code. The Commission found that the magazine, in the editing of the story, had substantially condensed the time-scale of events, leading to a significant inaccuracy being published. The complaint was therefore upheld. The adjudication was published in the 12th January edition of Pick Me Up.
